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How to find the Difficulty Level (DL) of a question?

Use this Rule of Thumb:

P+ value

[lower bound included], (upper bound excluded)

P+ less than 35	5
P+ between [35] and (55)	4
P+ between [55] and (70)	3
P+ between [70] and (80)	2
P+ equal to 80 or more	1

Difficulty Level

P+ for each question in a section is available on the Answer Key page for that Test.

The Raw Score to Scaled Score Conversion Tables at the end of individual tests in the Big Book use total Raw Scores for the 2 Quant Sections combined. You, however, will probably practice with only 1 Quant section at a time. Say you got a Raw Score of 24/30 on the first quant section of Test 1. Assume that you would have performed similarly on the second quant section of that test and look up the scaled score corresponding to a Raw Score of 48/60 (this was the old GRE score scale, from 200 to 800); for Test 1, this scaled score will be 700.

Then, use the [Old Scale to New Scale Concordance Table](#) provided by the ETS (reproduced on next slide) to find your quant score as per the present 130-170 scale.

For example, an old scale quant score of 700 corresponds to a new scale quant score of 155.

Thus, you will have found that a 24/30 performance in a quant section of Test 1 maps to a Q155.
